New Year – New YOU!!

Functional Skills and GCSEs are about setting the foundations to support you in taking the next steps in your studies, career path, and life. They support you in acquiring the skill sets and knowledge necessary to progress in your vocational study or apprenticeships.

Whilst often associated with exams, both GCSEs and Functional Skills are about getting each individual to a level of knowledge, understanding, and readiness to support them excel in education and life. Fear not - both Functional Skills and GCSE's are accepted by universities and employers.

CELT are working with St. Austell College to offer English and Maths Functional Skills to staff and parents. If we can secure enough participants, we can offer evening online sessions to support you to complete the qualification. The time required to complete the qualification varies with each participant but usually take approximately 8-12 weeks to complete. All adults are fully funded for the course if they do not have Level 2 (Grade A-C or equivalent) in English and/or Maths.

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

LUDWIG VAN BEETHOVEN

About: Ludwig van Beethoven (17th December 1770 – 26 March 1827) was a German composer and pianist who remains one of the most admired composers in the history of Western music; his works rank among the most performed of the classical music repertoire and span the transition from the Classical period to the Romantic era in classical music. In his early period, he forged his craft whilst his middle period showed an individual development from the styles of Haydn and Mozart. During this time, he began to grow increasingly deaf. In his late period, he extended his innovations in musical form and expression.
